Treasurer Update

As we head into the spring and summer months much of the work that has happened on the financial side of the house has been focused on evaluating where this year's budget has been under, over, or on par. Most of our line items on our budget cost less than what was budgeted for which will leave the house in good financial standing. We continue to operate with the goal of keeping rent as low as possible while having enough in our bank account to operate comfortably. For the most part, brothers have been on top of paying both chapter and national dues. A good

portion of my time when I took over from Antone in January revolved around chasing down delinquent dues and setting up fair payment plans with brothers who had fallen behind on their financial obligations to the house.

Looking toward the summer and beyond, both the new executive board and the board of trustees agreed that for brothers who live at 8 and 10 Regent Street over the summer months to shorten their commutes to internships, a set rate of rent per month will be required to help cover summertime costs associated with keeping the house open. I do anticipate that next year's rent for each brother will decrease for a couple reasons. The first is that the active brothers will have paid off an outstanding debt to the alumni that accrued several years back, and the second being we have a large group of new members who will be moving into the house. One specific goal related to the rent for next year will be to establish a flat rate of rent per term that does not fluctuate, we hope that this will help brothers be better prepared for how much they will be obliged to pay for the entire year.

We have been searching for a new landscaper who will give us a fair price for bi-weekly maintenance, if you are familiar with any landscaper who could give us competitive quote, please feel free to send me their contact info.
